

**International** **UAE opens French Church in Abu Dhabi**

ABU DABI, Oct. 25 (Saba) - The United Arab Emirates has opened the French Church in the capital Abu Dhabi, Emirates News Agency (WAM) reported. UAE Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research Sheikh Nahyan bin Mubarak Al Nahyan said his country will remain a symbol of tolerance, fraternity and equality, regardless of colour, religion or race.
